Executive Order: 104-03
Effective Date: May 11th, 2017

On November 19th of 2015, EMU held its Forum on Institutional Racism in Higher Education. During the forum, the Student 10-point plan was announced to better the experience for minorities as well as all races and ethnicities at EMU. On August 23rd of 2016, Student Body President Morton signed Executive Order 103-04 into effect and established the Black Student 10-Point Plan Commission. Therefore, in order to better the experience of and expand the well-being of students at EMU, I hereby re-establish the Black Student 10-point plan Commission.

This commission will be charged with assisting the progress underway at the university level in implementing the 10-point plan. The commission will investigate the current actions underway, research the financial applications of the plan, contact administrators, assist the Director of Diversity and Community Involvement, and oversee the overall implementation of the plan.

This commission will consist of the following voting members:

- The Student Body President, serving as Chair
- The BSU President, Serving as Vice-Chair
- Two students, one being a Student Government member, appointed by the Student Body President
- Two students, appointed by the BSU President
- The Residence Housing Association (RHA) President or their designee

The commission will be open to all registered students, faculty, and staff as non-voting members.

The commission, with consultation from the Student Body President and Vice-President, shall set a public meeting schedule. The commission will hold meetings at least once a month upon the start of the academic year in September.

The Senate will be regularly updated on the proceedings of the commission. All meetings will be open to the public and Student Government members are encouraged to attend.
