Housing Insecurity

Definition: Are you experiencing frequent moves, a crowded living space, poor housing quality, or inability to afford rent or bills (housing insecurity)?

or are you absent from a place to live, which includes living in a shelter, vehicle or abandoned structure (homelessness)?

- The CCLC provides free legal representation to people who cannot afford to hire an attorney. The clinic only conducts case intake and accepts new cases from the second week of September to mid-April each year.

If you're at risk of eviction, you have a right to a trial!

There are legal motions you can file that will give you more time to defend your rights, whether or not you have a lawyer yet. You can request a continuance (so that the trial is continued at a later date) in order to find a lawyer. Note that if you do this, you must ask to "reserve" your jury rights.

You can request a jury trial. A jury will usually be more sympathetic to a tenant, and a jury trial will buy you more time before a writ of eviction is issued. It usually costs money to request a jury trial, but **the fee can be waived** if you receive assistance through TANF, SSI, Medicaid, or other MDHHS programs, and **fill out a form called an MC 20**. MC 20s are available in the Ypsilanti Clerk's Office (located at 1 S Huron St, and open 8-5pm, Monday-Friday)

Make sure to bring your MDHHS When you show up to court, the landlord's attorney might offer you a "consent judgment." These can provide additional time, but entering into them means you lose the ability to raise defenses. The landlord's attorney doesn't have your best interests in mind, and **it is usually a good idea to have a lawyer look over something before signing.**

Transportation

Discounted Bus Passes (EMU only):

People's Express (PEX)

- Low cost public transportation service, can transfer riders to a number of bus stops on the AATA bus route. Most buses and vans are lift-equipped, all meet ADA requirements.
- Call at **877-214-6073** between 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM Monday through Friday to schedule your ride.
- Reservations must be made at least **three business days** in advance,
 - and a call back will be given one business day prior to your scheduled ride.
- On the day of your trip: drivers will wait five minutes. They may arrive up to *15 minutes before or after* scheduled pick up times.

Free Parking:

- Free Parking in Ypsi:
 - Frog Island Park, Riverside Park
 - Almost all street parking is free on the weekends and after 8pm on weekdays!

- *On campus:* None, so carpool if you can!
- **Word of advice:** a parking ticket is much cheaper (roughly \$25-50) than paying a towing company (\$300+)

- Laundry appointments (1.5hrs) are available Mon-Fri from 9 - 11, 11:15 - 1:15 and 1:30-3:30. washing machines are available for your use. High efficiency soap must be used. If you have none, Hope Center will provide it for you.
 - To schedule a Wash with Care appointment please call (734) 961-3124 on Fridays.
- **Baby Care:** free diapers, wipes, formula, and food if you are a parent or caregiver to young children. Each household is able to pick up supplies every two weeks, on Wednesdays 5:30–7:30 p.m. and Thursdays 2–4 p.m.
 - Basic supplies are available anytime during normal business hours at the Hope front desk.
